

Dr. Sungu Armagan is a Senior Instructor in the area of Organizational Behavior in the Global Leadership and Management (GLAM) Department in the College of Business at Florida International University. She received her Ph.D. from The University of Utah in Organizational Behavior and minored in Social Psychology. She teaches in the areas of "Happiness at Work," "Organizational Behavior," "Negotiations," and "International Negotiations". She teaches at the undergraduate and graduate levels. She won the best professor award from the Chapman Graduate School of Business at Florida International University (class of 2009 – Downtown MBA and MBA for Public Managers). Dr. Armagan conducts seminars and workshops for executives, managers, and non-managerial employees working at for-profit and non-profit organizations on "Happiness at Work and in Life" as well as "Managerial Negotiations".
